Our Ash Wednesday service will be held at 7:00 p.m. on March 2nd.

If you would like to have ashes imposed upon your forehead, you may come by the church from 7:00-8:00 am.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and praying. Christians make a cross on their foreheads because they feel shame and guilt about their sins. People help the poor and needy by providing essential things like clothing and food. We make the sign of the cross on our foreheads to remind us of our sinful nature and God's forgiveness. It marks the start of Lent, the 40 Days of penitence.



One of the most difficult tasks for any pastor is writing something timely and well, you know, brilliant for the monthly church newsletter. I have to admit, I've always been partial to February. It's the shortest month and usually there's just nothing to do because it's cold, it has only one decent holiday (Presidents Day) that used to be something else but I can't remember. Anyway, we are already in February, 2022, nearly TWO YEARS after we first heard of COVID-19. Who knew two years ago we would still be talking about this?

It is tragic that so many people in our world have contracted this virus, some survived with trauma, some have claimed the promise of the Resurrection, and some may have had it and did not even know. I am not a specialist in medical dialogue, however, I do know that we should be moving back toward some kind of new normal that will include this virus or some deviation of it, in our society, our world, forever. Meanwhile, take care of yourselves and your families. Eat healthy food, exercise, and rest. After this long ordeal, our spirits need a lift, too.

And that is why we have this community of faith called the Church. Without this connection, it would be ever so much harder to survive trials, sickness, grief, loss, etc. The Church is the Body of Christ in the world, and our task is to make disciple of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Every one of us as Christians has a gift that God can use for this task.

Our sermon series that began in January and will continue through February is titled, "Love Never Ends." It is about the amazing and endless love of God. We are studying the letters Paul wrote to the church at Corinth. The church there was somewhat like our churches today – almost negligent of their task to make disciples.
